The Board of Overseers met at 9:02 AM via ZOOM virtual meeting on Saturday, February 6, 2021. Overseers present were: Hank **Rauch** - Chair, Mandy **Meyer** – Vice-Chair, Tanya **Sweatt**, Judy **Hayes**, and Craig **Allard**. Other officers/appointees/contractors present were Sue **Spalding**, Clerk of the BIVC/Secretary to the Board of Overseers; Tony **DeBruyn**, Treasurer; Crawford and Candy **Taisey** of Straight Edge Construction, Superintendent; Bob **Canu**, BAC Chair, and Rob **Taisey**. 3 other islanders attended via ZOOM.

Discussion arising from correspondence:

- Re our postal transportation contract renewal, the USPS is unresponsive except by phone.
- The CCG Grant Agreement 6/30/21 deadline is for planning and design, not construction. Soil testing must be done before planning and design. Craig

reported his discussion with Charlotte that revealed that the water under the Municipal Building is due to roof runoff, not road runoff. We need to make a soil hole to test for drainage, plan for how to drain the water that is there, install roof gutters. Discussion re type of underpinnings to stabilize the building – need engineering advice? Specify sequence to get things done. Crawford will come back with a drainage mitigation proposal for Overseers.

7. Action items

Rob Taisey presented his recommendations for updating the solar system of the Community House, involving batteries and solar panels. Since it is probable that there will be limited use of the Community House in 2021 Rob will submit a proposal for 2022.

8. Capital Projects – Given the extensive discussion of drainage, underpinnings, gutters and other anticipated repairs at the Municipal Building, and review of the Community House solar batteries and panels earlier in the meeting, other capital project discussions were tabled until next meeting.

9. Old Business

- **a. Bailey Coffin Aquaculture proposal.** Check LD 106 for revisions to licensing procedures.
- **b. Continued remote island meetings** Sue and Judy

Two bills are under consideration by the Maine legislature. One (LD 32) is for statewide permission to continue remote participation, another addresses increasing participation in island corporation meetings, in the event that the state-wise permission is not granted. Sue and Judy are monitoring.

Ass't. Harbormaster Andy Spalding will research and report.

d. Non-compete Agreements

Following discussion, Mandy was asked to amend our current agreement to include all island employees, and to include a provision for the Board of Overseers to release an employee from the agreement in specific cases benefitting the island. Legal counsel will need to be consulted, with a special eye to avoiding any island liabilities.

Hank sent letters to the two new Freeport Town Councilors introducing them to Bustins.
