Harbormaster Job Description

General Responsibility:

The Harbormaster's responsibilities are as described in the B.I.V.C. Harbor Ordinance of 11 August, 1990. Duties and powers are defined in the following Rules and Regulations:

- 1. Title 38 M.S.R.A., Sec. one et. seq.
- 2. Rules of the Road, International and Inland, U.S. Coast Guard CG-169
- 3. F.C.C. Rules part 83
- 4. Maine Marine Resources Laws contained in Statues (Title 12, 32,17, 10 & 38)
- 5. Article XXI, HARBOR USE AND MOORING REGULATIONS, of the Bustins Island Village Corporation (BIVC) by-laws

Responsible to:

The Harbormaster is responsible to the B.I.V.C. Board of Overseers and is appointed for a term of one year.

Job Responsibility:

- 1. Regulate mooring spaces in the Bustins Island harbor as required. Maintain mooring records and technical specifications.
- 2. Assist mooring applicants in selection of proper ground tackle.
- 3. Assist in placement of moorings to i ensure the safety of vessels, adequacy of swing room and best use of space.
- 4. Establish and maintain anchorage areas and transient channels.
- 5. Maintain private aids to navigation in accordance with U.S.C.G. regulations.
- 6. Keep the Harbor and channels free of obstructions and insure the proper use of the Rules of the Road.
- 7. Patrol the harbor to ensure compliance with the state boating and other marine resources laws.
- 8. Be alert to any pollution of the harbor. Investigate and report to the Maine D.E.P. and the U.S.C.G., as required.
- 9. Control the use of the B.I.V.C. piers and wharves.

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- 10. Supervise and direct the activities of assistants.
- 11. Posting at the steamer dock and public float water protected copies of Article XXI of the BIVC By-Laws
- 12. Posting at the steamer dock and public float weather protected contact information for the harbormaster with a notation that transient vessels are to contact him for anchorage locations.
- 13. By May 15 of each year maintain and/or install appropriate markers to indicate the position of underwater hazards such as ledges. Keep such markers in good repair through October 31.
- 14. Assign anchorage locations to transient and/or non-property owners' vessels.
- 15. Inspect and recommend pier, float and mooring maintenance

- 5. Ground tackle and appendages as they relate to moorings, floats and navigational aids

- 9. Administrative and organizational procedures
