Boards and Committees Voting Policy

It is the policy of the Board of Overseers that all motions of this board, and all boards and committees appointed by the Board of Overseers, shall require a majority vote of all voting members to pass, not merely a majority of members present and voting, unless otherwise particularly provided in the applicable ordinance or regulation. A quorum for any board is a sufficient number of voting members present to pass a motion.

Where a board has both regular members and associate or alternate members, an associate or alternate member becomes a voting member for that meeting when filling the seat of an absent member.

This voting policy in no way restricts a board member's independent actions, between meetings, that are authorized by statute, policy or dire necessity.

Examples:

#1 – Board of 5 members, 2 members absent for a meeting, 3 members present. There is a quorum and the meeting can be held. All three members present must vote in the affirmative to pass any motion.

#2 – Board of 5 members and 2 associate members, all 7 members present for a meeting. Only 5 voting members in the meeting since associates only can vote as a substitute for an absent member. A motion will require 3 votes in the affirmative to pass.

#3 - Board of 5 members and 2 associate members, 2 members and 1 associate member present. Associate can vote in absence of a member so quorum requirement is met. All three voting members present must vote in the affirmative to pass any motion.
