Hello Islanders,

As we look ahead to the opening of our summer season, we anticipate many challenges that we must navigate through during this public health crisis.

One of the only things we know with certainty is that this will be a very different season than we have ever experienced.

The Board of Overseers has increased meeting frequency to work on a timeline and protocols for the start of **public transportation**, with the potential opening of very limited access to associated public spaces. We will do this in tandem with, and adhering to, all Maine State mandates and the Maine CDC directives as Maine begins to relax guidelines to open its economy. We will meet weekly through May with an initial focus on keeping Bustins employees as safe as possible as we look at opening Bustins public transportation, which includes, but is not limited to: the Island Ferry (Lilly B), the Island Truck and the people and processes associated with those services. Several island committees are helping to facilitate the necessary changes as well. We are all hands on deck.
